The 505 Euro Cup Rules

1. Regattas

The 505 Euro Cup consists of the following regattas:

Early spring:	A regatta in southern France
Ascension Day holiday:	Riva del Garda, Italy
Late June:	Kiel Week, Germany
July or later:	EuroCup Finals

The final will either be the 505 Worlds when this held is in Europe, or the European Championship when it isn't.

2. Scoring system

The Euro Cup will be scored using the low point system counting the final position from each of the regattas – with one possible discard if a team participated in all four. The result of the final regatta cannot be discarded.

The points given for a regatta in which a team does not participate (start at least once) is the total number of participants in the E-Cup series.

To be counted as a participant in more than one regatta, 2 out of the 3 variables (Boat, Skipper and Crew.) must remain constant between all regattas. Changing between being a crew or a skipper does not count as a change. That means that a crew can change boat, mid season or a crew can skipper in the next regatta and still be counted as the same participant.

3. Prizes

The organizer of the European Championships or Worlds is responsible for organizing prizes to the top 10 participants in the EuroCup. The combination of Skipper and Crew at the final event receives the prize.

4. The authority
